Welcome to the second edition of **Heartbeat** . . . the newsletter for independent schools.

The Core requirements for accreditation:

The policy for the quality assurance and monitoring of independent schools and private assessment bodies, promulgated by the Minister of Basic Education on 29 October 2012, outlines 4 criteria for the accreditation of independent schools, namely school ethos; leadership, management and communication; teaching and learning; and school results. Against each of these criteria is a number of indicators against which a school's compliance with the criteria are measured. The core criteria which a school must meet in order to be granted accreditation are the following:
CRITERION 1: SCHOOL ETHOS

- The vision and mission of the school are educationally sound.
- There is no unfair discrimination towards learners

CRITERION 2: LEADERSHIP, MANAGEMENT AND COMMUNICATION

- The Head of the school has a professional teaching qualification and current registration with the South African Council for Educators (SACE).

 There is a governance structure in place, which ensures accountability in the school and
- provides strategic direction.
- The school is financially viable.
 The school received an unqualified audit report for the most recent financial year end (other than the qualification regarding recording of donations).
- There is a valid, current Health and Safety Certificate (not older than 2 years) for the school and hostel.
- The school has suitable, safe and sufficient facilities to discharge proper education as envisaged in the school's vision and mission statement.

CRITERION 3: TEACHING AND LEARNING

- Teacher Qualifications and SACE registration:
 - For 7 years' accreditation: At least 80% of teachers hold a completed professional teaching qualification and have current registration with the South African Council for Educators (SACE)
 - For 1 year provisional accreditation: Between 75% and 79% of teachers hold a completed professional teaching qualification and have current registration with
- The school demonstrates capacity in the development and management of learning programmes in line with the minimum outcomes of the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements (CAPS).
- The school demonstrates the capacity to administer assessment at the required standard.
- Learners are given support and feedback.

CRITERION 4: SCHOOL RESULTS

INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS SUB-UNIT UPDATE:

A reviewed accreditation process has been implemented as from 01 April 2016. All new applications received as at that date will follow the new accreditation process. Schools which started the process prior to 01 April 2016, but did not pay the amounts due, their applications have been rejected on the system and credit notes issued for the amounts which had previously been invoiced. To get back into the process, these schools must log back in to their profiles using the same username and password created previously, and resubmit the letter of intent to apply for

The changes which have taken place since 1 April 2016 include the following:

- Payment will be made per step of the accreditation process and no longer in two tranches. This means that payment for each step will be payable before the next step can take place, and no step will be executed before the amount invoiced for has been paid.
- All applicants must attend a compulsory Quality Promotion meeting prior to completing their self-evaluation report. These workshops are meant to ensure that applicants are fully aware of the evidence required for the self-evaluation and all information pertaining to the preparation for the site visit. Attendance of these meetings will be by invitation. Only the applicants who have submitted their letter of intent to apply for accreditation and whose letter of intent has been accepted, will be invited.
- If the evidence required for the self-evaluation is not satisfactorily submitted, the self-evaluation report will be returned to the applicant to rework and resubmit with the correct evidence. Only two resubmissions will be allowed. If there is no improvement, the entire submission will be rejected. The applicant will then be required to make a new application and pay for the new application from the beginning of the process. Applicants will be liable for all the costs pertaining to evaluation of each resubmission.
- site visit will only take place once the applicant has satisfactorily submitted the required evidence for the self-evaluation report and the requisite site visit fee is paid. Applicants who request a delay of the site visit will retain the status of "unaccredited" until such time as they are found to
- be compliant with the self-evaluation process.

"Red" and "Green" status

In order to be reported to the provincial department of education or the Accredited Private Assessment bodies as being compliant with the requirements of Umalusi for 2017 (a "green" colour coding), a school must have been through the accreditation process and received an outcome of 7 years' accreditation or 1 year provisional accreditation by 31 October 2016, or have made considerable progress in the process (that is, at least successfully submitted the self-evaluation report) by 31 October 2016.

Confirmed schools which were required to submit the self-evaluation report or monitoring report and have not done so by that date, and schools with 7 years' accreditation and were required to submit a monitoring report but have not done so **by 31 October 2016**, will be reported as not compliant for 2017 (a "red" colour coding).
